




To be eligible, applicants had to meet all of the following eligibility criteria:

- Which part of your higher education experience do you feel will benefit you most after you earn your degree?





Scholarship Recipient Adekunle Popoola ~ Cuyahoga Community College

Adekunle has volunteered for many activities on campus including an Enrollment Center campaign, nurse pinning ceremony, providing hot meals to homeless at St. Malachi's Episcopal Church, and Cleveland Public Theater Station Hope. He is a member of Tri-C's Metropolitan Care team, and an Honor society member of both the college and Phi Theta Kappa.

Serving hot meals to the homeless was a humbling experience for Adekunle that "highlighted the importance of empathy and humility and the fact that leadership and service are two things that should not be mutually exclusive."
