GARLAND G. PARKER AWARD by Cindy Davis

Another "award season" has just finished on our campuses. Whether you are involved in planning the honors convocation, or helping with commencement, or if you just enjoy your students' successes from your computer screen, I hope you feel inspired by the accomplishments of the students we work to serve. For me this time serves as a great annual reminder of why I do that work that I do. I thought this was the perfect time to share a bit about OACRAO's own awards and the stories behind them. OACRAO has two awards it can bestow on deserving members: the Parker Award and the Ryland Award, as they are commonly referred to, are named after two distinguished leaders in our profession.



Garland G. Parker came to the University of Cincinnati as an assistant professor of history in 1948. He was appointed Registrar in 1956 and retired in 1980 as Vice Provost for Admissions and Records and Executive Director of the Office for Enrollment Policy and Educational Research. That's 52 years as a Bearcat. A search of UC's website lists many articles in the *UC News Record* revealing Garland Parker as a leader working on the pressing issues of a campus in the tumultuous times of the civil rights era and during the Vietnam war. He spoke out against requiring photos of applicants and chaired the sub-committee assigned to review the university's discrimination policy statement in 1967. There is mention of protests and staff taking records home at night to protect them from vandalism. Garland Parker was there for the development of the Buckley Amendment, now known as FERPA. The January 7, 1975 News Record contains the headline: "UC beats Congress to punch on restrictions to file access." He was the author of over 100 scholarly publications, including annual reports on American collegiate enrollments and studies of the educational system in Jordan, Syria and Iraq.

Garland Parker served as President of OACRAO in 1966 and chaired the annual meeting at Bowling Green State University. He also served as President of AACRAO. If you are putting together the genealogy of our profession, Garland Parker served as Lynn Barber's fraternity advisor and encouraged Lynn to work in higher education instead of going to medical school. Lynn worked 38 years at UC, 27 as University Registrar.

The "Parker Award" is named for a true leader in our profession and serves as a reminder of the vital role our work plays on campus and in the lives of students. Next month, I will highlight OACRAO's other award, the Linus J. Ryland Award.
