Antioch College Granted Accreditation

Antioch College is proud to announce that the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) has granted it accreditation. Since the College independently re-opened in 2011, it has been in a rigorous, multi-stage accreditation process. In June 2014, Antioch College was named a candidate for accreditation and was allowed to pursue early initial accreditation on a two-year path, rather than the traditional four-year timeline.

The HLC reviewed Antioch's assurance argument, the report of the site team who visited the College in fall 2015, the report of the Institutional Actions Council (IAC) hearing committee that met in April 2016 and the College's responses to these reports. In the College's determination letter, the president of the HLC, Barbara Gellman-Danley, said "Let me commend you for the passion of your alumni, the Yellow Springs community, board and institutional leadership, students and other stakeholders. Your efforts clearly reflect Horace Mann's greatest quote, and you have indeed won 'some victory' today." Horace Mann, the College's first president, implored the class of 1859 to "Be ashamed to die until you have won some victory for humanity."

The effective date of accreditation aligns with the Class of 2016's graduation date—they are the first class have graduated from an accredited Antioch College since re-opening.

In a message to the Antioch College Board of Trustees, President Tom Manley said, "Accreditation is the first step in actualizing the Framework for Antioch College's Transition (FACT) that I shared at our June board meeting. It will also open other doors, like
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developing a program to admit international students, and having access to support from philanthropic foundations that were closed to us previously.”

FACT is Manley’s new educational and fiscal platform that envisions the campus as a virtual laboratory where students learn through rigorous field and work-based study that will position them for success throughout their lives. Financially, FACT offers a new, more affordable and highly entrepreneurial approach to funding operations by integrating and leveraging assets as major building blocks for learning and revenue generation. The College’s assets include: the co-op work program, WYSO 91.3 FM, the Wellness Center, the energy/sustainability program, the farm and food program, Glen Helen Nature Preserve, the Coretta Scott King Center, Antioch College Village and others. The College’s trustees recently approved a 32-unit co-housing pilot of the Antioch College Village project.

Gregory Crawford Chosen As Miami University's 22nd President

As of July 1, Gregory P. Crawford will become Miami University’s next president. Crawford, professor of physics and vice president and associate provost at the University of Notre Dame, will become Miami’s 22nd president following the June 30 retirement of President David Hodge.

“I am deeply honored to be the incoming president at Miami University,” Crawford said. “Miami is a very special place, with a unique mission and an extraordinary reputation.”

Crawford also has served as the William K. Warren Foundation Dean of Notre Dame’s College of Science. He has a doctorate in chemical physics from Kent State University. He has published more than 400 research and education publications, review articles and book chapters and holds more than 20 U.S. patents and patent applications.

Crawford, an Ohio native, joined Notre Dame’s faculty in 2008. He previously served as the dean of engineering at Brown University, where he had been a professor of physics and engineering. “Having spent my career at two institutions with a strong emphasis on undergraduate teaching and learning, focused on undergraduate research, scholarship and the creative and liberal arts, I believe Miami is a perfect fit for my experience, values and philosophy of higher education,” he said.

He added, “We (wife, Renate Crawford) were truly inspired by the students, faculty and staff we met – their accomplishments, their passion for their work, their zeal for the institution – and the alumni who have such dedication and loyalty to their alma mater.”
