The 2003-04 Almanac Issue of The Chronicle of Higher Ed states there are 178 colleges and universities in Ohio serving almost 550,000 enrolled students (Fall 2000 data used), with 93,000 degrees awarded (2000-01 year used). My count of schools in the OACRAO directory is 115.

We have much to embrace and celebrate. OACRAO is helping 5 high school graduates pursue higher ed opportunities via the scholarship awards. These 5 students are recognized on page 9 of this Newsletter.

My thanks to all that have contributed to the profession and to OACRAO and my anticipation and welcome to all that will join our ranks soon.

She was co-chair of the Local Arrangements Committee in 2001. Connie is a member of the AACRAO "College and University" Committee and regularly attends the annual meetings. She has presented at OACRAO, AACRAO and various other professional conferences.

Secretary: Steve Midkiff is the Registrar at Shawnee State University. Prior to this, he was Shawnee's Director of Records and Admission Representative. Steve holds a B.A. in Education from the University of Kentucky, a Master of Education in Educational Psychology from Harvard University and a PhD in Higher Education Administration from Ohio University. He has been a member of OACRAO since 1984. Steve has served on and chaired many program planning committees, served on several auditing committees and was a member of LAC for the annual conference in Athens.

Vice President/Membership Development: Bob Kubat is the Registrar at Miami University. Reflections of an OACRAO Retiree

Your editor asked that I write an article that would share

tor asked that I write an article that would share with you my 31 years of involvement in our profession. It's always difficult to know where to begin, what to include or how to close but I'll start with some background for the reader's perspective. I'm a Cincinnati boy that went up the road to Miami University during the Viet Nam conflict. We entered school in one era and left in different one, after turbulent change for the nation and colleges. Like many students, I came to campus with a career objective that changed – more than once. So after becoming a certified teacher in mathematics and finding out you couldn't teach it in the best way, I looked for a graduate assistantship that would keep me in a college environment. At the last office that might have one available, the Registrar, Ken Bogard, explained he had just selected someone else but asked if I'd consider a full time job instead. So this career began.

Looking back, I can't imagine a better place to get started than working for Ken at Miami. He started me on data reporting then room scheduling was added. Ken always encouraged participation in association activities and this was the time for Akron's "Embrace of ARMS" notoriety promoted by Howard Baldwin. Ken supported my participation in a MODS (Management of Data for Students) program and during one summer week the most practical of workshops ever about registrar-ing organized by John O'Neil at Ohio University. Dick Rainsburger and Bob Patterson were among the attendees if memory serves correctly. I've lamented

having lent my workshop notebook to someone years later when AACRAO began discussing the REG 101 program. When Tom Bilger, AACRAO's current president-elect, left Miami for Frostburg, I moved into the office's registration area. Jim Blackburn's departure from that office to become registrar at Marion colleagues began saying Bogard was running a "cradle of registrars." It also brought Lynis Ryland into our office. During the last couple years there I got more involved working with Jack Southard to build student electronic records for Miami. Ken and Jack finally agreed with me that Miami could build a better degree audit than Georgia State or Purdue that last winter there giving birth to DARS.

One thing happened in early 1978 as OACRAO leadership met to plan the annual meeting at Salt Fork State Park. Finishing late in the evening two from the Cleveland area, Keith Miles and Tim Boylan, left for home concerned about the weather change. The rest of us spent the next day watching the lobby glass flex as a blizzard raged. After being snowed-in two more days, I set out on the five-hour drive back to Oxford. It took about 9 or 10 hours as I dodged trucks buried on I-70 which was better than looking for something to eat in the lodge without staff or worrying about how to come up with the cash to pay for the unexpected nights spent at the park. Keith and Tim made it part of the way and got to know some firemen really well, we found out later.

Moving on to Ohio State as Director of Registration, Records and Scheduling in 1981 turned out to be a great opportunity. In the first two years, I worked with three different bosses, realized that I was naive about only working an 8-hour day, and encountered personnel problems that took much more time solve than I ever imagined. The year I arrived a new president came to Ohio State and wanted to do something for students. I proposed a "Three Year plan" and four years later Ohio State had eliminated

board sheets (to tick mark students' add/drops), paper record copies in college offices and grade cards; begun to install DARS; implemented automated room scheduling, Touchtone/Voice Response registration and a data research unit. The staff went from almost 90 full-time and about 100 part-time to 65, about a third professional or technical staff. None of these remarkable changes would have happened without the contributions of a tremendously dedicated staff and the cooperation of a couple key university community members, a quiet success. There's not space on the page to mention them all by name.

The year it was a privilege for me to serve OACRAO as president, I also was invited to be Exhibits Chair for AACRAO's meeting in Cincinnati. Both were remarkable opportunities to develop deep friendship with wonderful colleagues. The LAC work allowed friendships to span to several stalwart OACAC members I had only heard about. Isn't it again time for OACRAO to host some large AACRAO activity? I hope you never give up attempting to welcome Ohio's admissions staff and relate with OACAC.

There are many fond memories involving knowing and working with the CIC's (Big Ten + Chicago) registrars. A few of us started an annual conclave for the major research university registrars in 1986 and created the Registrar's Summer Institute in 1992-3 to "pay forward" for some of the professional support we received.

The most recent experience for me in this profession has been with AACRAO leadership. AACRAO was in crisis at the time I was nominated for Secretary/Treasurer. As we came to Chicago president-elect Paul Anderson was also filling in as treasurer, the board had decided a new executive director was needed, and the two of us put the budget together from Paul's memory the evening before it was needed and I ran it to Kinko's at 2 am so it could be presented. After being elected, I made a first trip to the office in May, found out the IRS 990 was due Monday and spent the weekend trying to locate

financial data to put it together. Then we found out AACRAO was not incorporated. That is behind AACRAO now I can assure you, after completing the presidential term this April. It operates with energetic leadership, sound business practices, a strategic plan that is tightly coupled with its budget and daily operation, and is poised to grow with more member support. Won't you make a contribution?

So in 30+ years one sees lots of change. You realize any success you had comes from others cooperation, their work, and the support of your spouse. I can see that the enrollment services profession has gone through a huge period of specialization and now its professionals really need a comprehensive approach. The information age is reducing the need to devote so much time to transactions. We've done a good job collecting and storing data, but only started delivering it or making it useful for our institutions. And, today's registrar frontier is supporting student advising. Expanding authority never substituted for cooperative effort. All of those topics and a few others are for further elaboration at another time. Best wishes to you all and I look forward to seeing you in November.
