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STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

The OACRAO scholarship committee annually awards 3 students with a \$1,000 scholarship each. Applicants must meet all of the following criteria for scholarship eligibility:

- Current enrollment, at least half-time, at an OACRAO-affiliated college or university
- Current student worker within the Registrar's, Admissions, Student Services, or Enrollment Management offices
- Good academic standing

The application will go live at **3:00 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 29**, at: [OACRAO Scholarship Application](#) and will close at 11:59 p.m. on Oct. 31, 2017.

The applications were highly competitive last year!

Applications are time-stamped, so late applications will not be accepted.

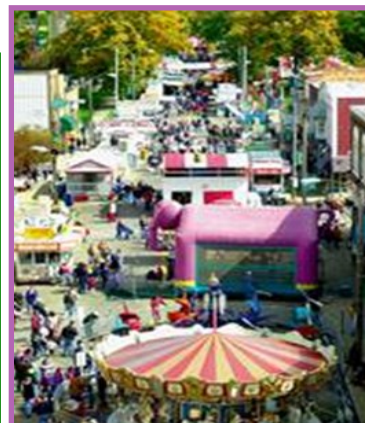
